CATHOLIC SISTERS IN AMERICA

Sacramento will be the last venue for an outstanding three-year traveling exhibit called **“Women & Spirit: Catholic Sisters in America,”** sponsored by the Leadership Conference of Women Religious (LCWR) and the Smithsonian Museums. A consortium of American religious women began almost eight years ago to dream and plan a way to share the incredible contribution of Catholic Sisters to education, health care, and social work in American life. One of the planning committee was Sister Helen Garvey, BVM, former Congregation President. Her energy and commitment to this project have been remarkable.

“From the time the Ursulines arrived in New Orleans in 1727 up to today, women religious have made an incalculable contribution to this nation. Running schools, hospitals and orphanages from America’s earliest days, these women helped foster a culture of social service that has permeated our society. Over the centuries these courageous women overcame many obstacles--both physical and cultural--to bring their civilizing and caring influence to every corner of the country. Understanding and celebrating the history of women religious is essential to understanding and celebrating the history of America.”—Cokie Roberts, news analyst and author

Women & Spirit opened in May, 2009 in Cincinnati, then moved on to Dallas, then to the Smithsonian itself in Washington, DC at the beginning of 2010. Then it was presented in Cleveland and at Ellis Island/Statue of Liberty National Monument. From January through May of this year, it was at the National Mississippi River Museum in Dubuque, IA, and then moved to Mount St. Mary’s College in Los Angeles. It is now in South Bend, IN at Notre Dame University and St. Mary’s College. It will be viewed for the final time as a complete exhibit from January 24 through June 3, 2012 at the California Museum

of History, Women & the Arts in Sacramento.

The exhibit includes many artifacts loaned by various Congregations – including the following: a letter from President Jefferson to the Ursuline Sisters at the time of the Louisiana Purchase in 1803, assuring them that the US government would respect their right to retain their own property; the cap and bonnet worn by the BVMs in the 1840s; the collection of heartbreaking, handwritten notes pinned to infants who were left on the porch of the New York City Foundling Hospital; the photos and account of the tragic loss of life and property of an entire beach-front orphanage destroyed by a hurricane which devastated Galveston, TX in 1900; immigration documents of Sisters who emigrated from all parts of Europe in the 19th century; photos and accounts of the Catholic Sisters who marched in Selma, AL with Martin Luther King, Jr.

In addition to the national exhibit, there will be a section showcasing the contributions of almost 40 congregations in California, including the BVMs. An entire website of the exhibit can be found at www.womenandspirit.org

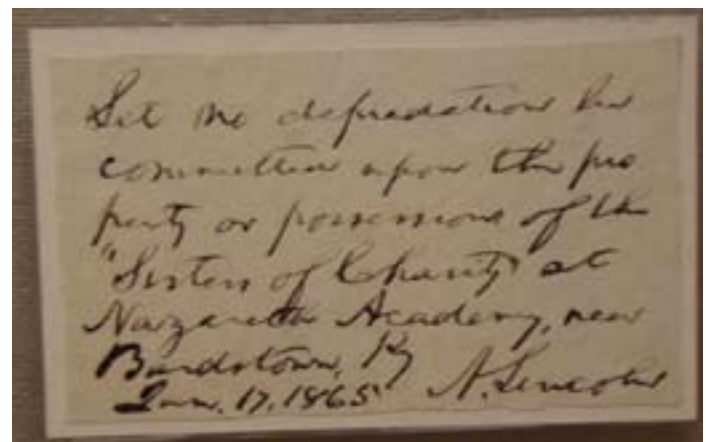
AN INVITATION!

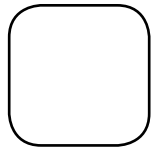
