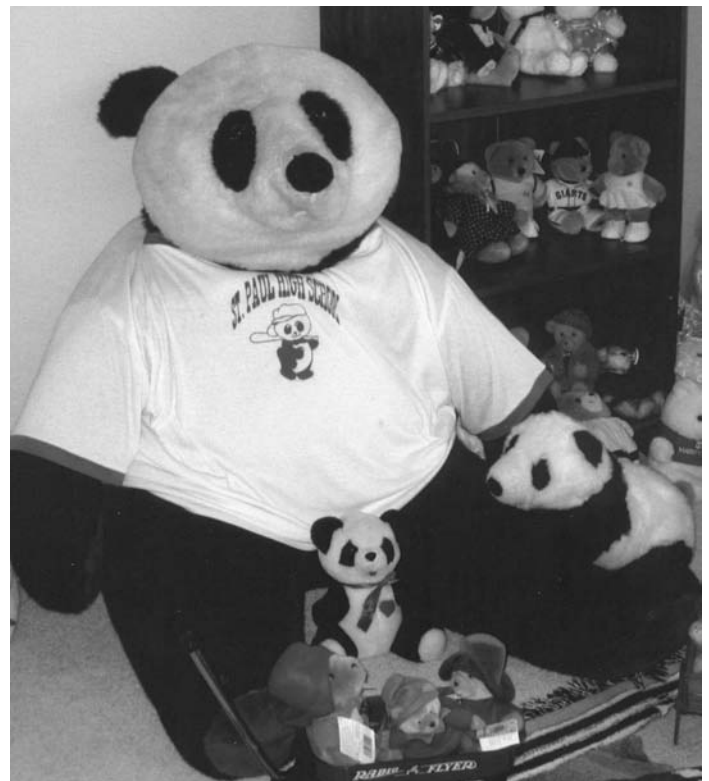

BENEFACTOR, JOHN MORIARITY

Over the last years of the operation of St. Paul High School, a wonderful benefactor appeared, granting assistance for a selected graduate from each class. This "angel" was John Moriarity.

For twenty years, John was the dean and vice-principal at George Washington High School in San Francisco. His love of young people and quality education impelled him to support students and institutions. He provided substantial assistance to a financially needy but academically promising student through her four years at college, including books and other fees as part of his gift. He followed some all the way through law school. Among SPHS students adopted in this way were: Juliet Valera Lem '92, Maria Lopez '93, Thania Rodriguez '94, Natasha Platon '94, and Jule Ann Garilao '94. He also adopted students who began at St. Paul's and finished at other Catholic schools: Sofia Arellano '95 (SI), Ana Maria Mendez '96 (ICA), and Gisella Vidalon '97 (SI). He has touched the lives of countless students throughout the Bay Area in this way.

In his Christmas 2004 greeting, he wrote: "As I've said to so many people, 'Sr. Maureen was the most talented principal I've come across. She did so much with so little assistance.' Those St. Paul's girls were the greatest. I have such fond memories of those exquisite graduations."

He has many projects. As a contractor, John is known to some as the driving force behind a nine year, eighteen major project effort to renovate St. Charles School at 16th and South Van Ness Avenue. The Center and scholarships which he has established are named for his parents, Daniel and Mary Moriarity.

Taught by the Sisters of the Holy Names at St. Cecilia's, he recently attended a dinner in the East Bay, honoring students who had participated in Summer Search. He was so impressed by the presentation of senior Roxana Vargas of Holy Names High School, Oakland (where former SPHS faculty Sr. Karen Conover, BVM and Nancy Barrett are among the faculty and administration) as she spoke about her six weeks in a Buddhist monastery in Tibet that she has become his most recent awardee. Principal Sister Sally Slyngstad, snjm, was captivated by John's energy and enthusiasm for students and their education!

What a legacy of positive influence. We are continually grateful for this witness to the gospel imperative: "The gift you have been given, give as a gift!" His time, talent and treasure are being multiplied a hundred-fold.

Sister,

Your words- - tears come to my eyes as I read them. Page 6 of the Alumnae News told me a classmate, one whom I met again at our 40th reunion in 2002, is now among those deceased for whom the November prayers are to be offered. Page 2 told me of a SPHS alumna who lost her house to Hurricane Charley.

And I'm sad for myself for my losses in Hurricane Ivan. I have thin hope that the trusses and roof and ceiling and carpets can be replaced before Thanksgiving, following this disaster that happened to every home and building in my town of Atmore, Alabama on September 16. Insurance compensation and FEMA relief to fix the damage are exceedingly slow in arriving. But, we were rescued during the first four weeks by virtual armies of power company people from northern regions of the U.S. plus legions of Baptists with food and water and Mennonites with chainsaws and trucks.

FEMA categorized Hurricane Ivan as Disaster No. 1549. I'm sorry I paid so little heed to the suffering of the people who endured the previous 1548 events. Lucky for them they did not wait for me to come to their rescue. I am comforted by the thought that we were/are wrapped around with prayer, and I know that is exactly the source of the protection that graced us that night.
