ANNUAL DUES

The Alumnae Board has reviewed the timing of our request for annual dues, which helps to defray the cost of printing and mailing the Newsletter. From now on, the Summer Newsletter will contain the request that dues be paid. This will separate it from the Annual Luncheon which is in November.

Many thanks to the 78 additional alumnae members who sent in dues at the time of the Spring 2005 Fundraiser. Added to the 369 members who paid dues in November 2004 and the months following, this bring us to 447 alumnae who have paid dues this year.

While this is good, it must be remembered that the Newsletter is sent first class mail to 3,450 alumnae. So, this represents only about 13% of all who receive the Newsletter.

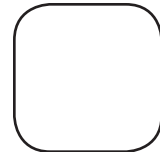
And WHY is it sent first class mail? We have found that two of our issues are “time sensitive” — for the Luncheon and the Fundraiser raffle. We cannot depend on Bulk Mail being delivered on time. Also, with “Return Service Requested” on first class mail, we get a change of address from the Postal Service if it is within a six months period following someone’s moving. Otherwise, we would lose that address. Unfortunately, most people do not think to send us a change of address.

(Yes, some 300 will now receive it on line which will save some cost. More will hopefully want this way of receiving it. But these folks must be sure to update both mailing and email addresses when there is any change.)
