MEMORIES IN BLOOM FUNDRAISER A SUCCESS!

The alumnae of St. Paul High School are great! but we all knew that before the “Memories in Bloom” annual fundraiser. This annual request for sponsors of the event and for support of the grand raffle allows the Alumnae Association to continue the following good works: ensure full funding for the publication of three issues of the newsletter, provide tuition assistance for children and grandchildren of alumnae who attend Catholic high schools, contribute to the BVM Sisters retirement needs, and support a local shelter for women and children.

This year, the sponsors contributed \$31,731 and the raffle brought in \$6,008, for a gross total of \$37,739. Expenses for printing, the reception, and cash prizes for the raffle totaled \$6,825, resulting in a wonderful net profit of **\$30,914**.

SISTER MARY ST. JULIAN FLAHERTY, BVM 100TH BIRTHDAY PARTY

Julia (Judi) Sullivan-Rigney '68 wrote of the Dubuque celebration for **Sister Mary St. Julian Flaherty's** 100th birthday. Sister was a St. Paul HS faculty member from 1949-55 and was for many years the moderator of the Alumnae Association.

"I am a niece of Sister Mary St. Julian. She taught Latin and English to senior classes for many years at St. Paul's, including my freshman year. I was one of the relatives who joined the family in Dubuque, Iowa for her 100th birthday celebration. There were 26 relatives who attended on St. Patrick's Day (March 17th), including another St. Paul's graduate and niece, **Carol Ann Gillespie Duenas '63**. Although her actual birthday is March 20th, Sister chose that weekend because she is of Irish descent.

Family came from Ireland, Lima, Peru, Indiana, Arizona, and California to delight in and celebrate this absolutely glorious event for her 100th year on the earth. Relatives started arriving on Thursday, February 15th, and all met with her on Friday in Caritas Conference Center to have a conversation with her, join in pictures with her as the "star," and attend dinner with her in the dining room afterward. She was asked during the Friday celebration if she wanted to go to her room and rest. Her answer was, 'No, I'll have plenty of time to rest.' There was a wonderful Mass in her honor on Saturday in the Marian Hall Chapel, after more visiting with family in the morning. During the sermon at the Mass, one Sister said she asked SM St. Julian what she thought of turning

100 years old, and St. Julian's answer was, 'I wouldn't aspire to it.' Although she is blind and wears a hearing aid because she is also deaf, she never took a break on Saturday. I visited with her 3-1/2 years ago in Dubuque when she first started losing her vision and hearing. She shared with me at that time that she told God she could accept losing her vision and hearing, although she hated to see these two faculties leave, but prayed so very hard she would be able to keep her mind. She has been granted her wish.

I also had the honor of seeing **Sr. Rosemary (Michael David) Sage (Faculty)**. She looks absolutely wonderful at 93 years old!"

Betty Carey '41 is a former BVM and now a BVM Associate living in Dubuque. She also wrote of the celebration.

"I went to the celebration at Mt. Carmel and it was so great. Mass at 11 o'clock and St. Julian and her youngest sister from Petaluma brought up the gifts at the offertory. Someone said her sister is in her 90's. Then on to the Caritas Center dining room for a great dinner. She had about 50 guests — two cousins from Ireland (they were precious) and family and friends from Peru, Indiana, and California plus Iowa, of course. They served corned beef and cabbage, but also what Sister ordered — country fried chicken. A big birthday cake and ice cream followed. **Sister Mary Ann Zollmann, [BVM Vice-President and St. Paul HS Faculty 1972-80]** had those who had been at St. Paul's gather around her table and sing our school song. We gave it our best and, lo and behold, St. Julian mouthed all the words — she remembered that song. It was a great celebration and I know she enjoyed it very much — she had a little twinkle in her eye."

At the end of the Mass, all present extended their hand over SM St. Julian and sang this blessing:

"The hand of God shall hold you,
the peace of God enfold you,
the love that dreamed and formed you
still surrounds you here today;
The light of God beside you, above,
beneath, inside you,
the light that shines to guide you home
to the loving hand of God."

At the spring fundraiser reception, the Sister Mary Carlita Service Award was presented to **Sr. Karen Conover, BVM**. When Alumnae President **Marilyn Highlander-Pool** announced the award, Sister Karen was all ready with her camera to take the picture for the Newsletter. Sister Karen was on the high school faculty from 1980-1994, teaching religion, chemistry, choral music, and later working as Assistant Principal, with responsibilities in admissions and tuition assistance. Since the school's closure in 1994, Sister has edited and written most of the copy for the SPHS Newsletter, published three times a year. She maintains the data base of the alumnae information and is in contact with alumnae as they share their joys and sorrows, plan reunions, get married and have children, and grieve the loss of loved ones.

Twenty young women and men were the recipients of the St. Paul High School Alumnae Tuition Assistance grants of \$1,500. These students are children and grandchildren of alumnae who are attending a Catholic high school this coming year. The grants are due to the generosity of our wonderful alumnae members during the annual fundraiser and a bequest from an alumna to be used specifically for this purpose. This number represents a significant increase in applicants over those applying in the past few years. The ever-rising cost of tuition, well over \$10,000 a year, is the bill facing hard-working parents. We are pleased to help make Catholic secondary school a bit more possible.

SISTER CARLITA SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED

On May 31st, the Sister Mary Carlita Scholarship for 2007 was awarded to **Cynthia Santestiban**. This scholarship is given annually to a female graduate of St. Paul School in recognition of good character, service, and generosity, which were the hallmarks of the life of Sister Mary Carlita.
