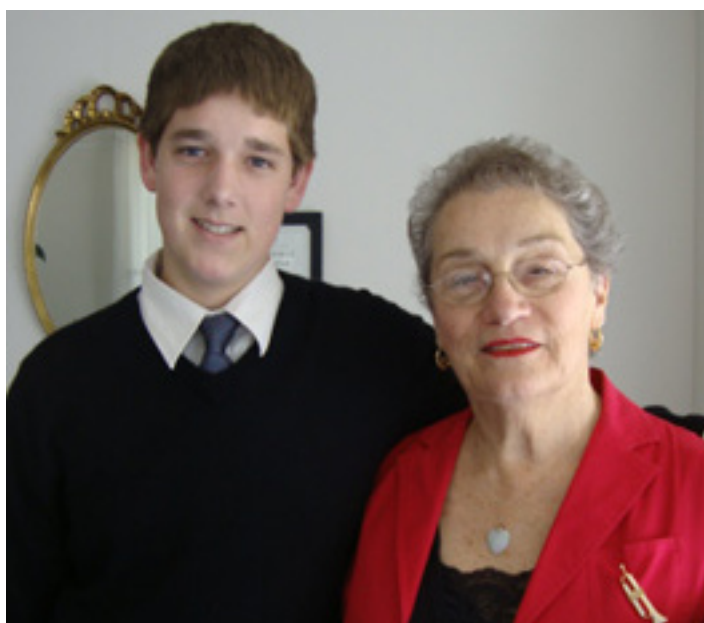

The annual fundraiser reception held on Saturday, April 24, 2010, gave the Alumnae a chance to say "thank you" to the many donors who contributed so generously to the appeal for support this year. The theme was "Up, Up, and Away" and the committee had lovely miniature multi-colored hot air balloons hanging from the light fixtures in the rectory entryway and dining room. Delicious refreshments were enjoyed by the guests, while they engaged in pleasant conversation.

The sponsors and others who made donations to the Fundraiser sent in \$24,359 and the Grand Raffle secured an additional \$5,314, for a grand total of \$29,673! The expenses of the raffle prizes, the mailing for the fundraiser and the reception are covered from these proceeds. The winners of the Grand Raffle prizes are listed on p. 3.

With a diminishing alumnae base and difficult economic times, the Alumnae Association is very grateful to all who gave of their treasure to support the good works of St. Paul High School Alumnae. According to the Board's decision some years ago, the profit is distributed 75% to tuition assistance, 20% to the BVM Sisters retirement fund, and 5% to a women's and children's shelter. In addition, the Sister Mary Carlita Scholarship of \$4,000 and the support for the printing and mailing of the three newsletters must also be provided for.

Thirty-one young women and men were the recipients of the St. Paul High School Alumnae Tuition Assistance grants of \$1,000 for 2010-2011. These grants are possible due to the generosity of our wonderful Alumnae during the annual fundraiser and bequests that were given to support Catholic education. These students are children and grandchildren of alumnae who are attending a Catholic high school this coming year. The ever-rising cost of tuition, sometimes approaching \$15,000 a year, and a slumping economy faces hard-working parents who want to keep their sons and daughters in a religious, value-based school. There were many wonderful examples of involvement and service made by the students and delightful comments about them in their character references. We are pleased to help make Catholic secondary school a bit more possible for them and their families.

Sister Mary Ann Shea, BVM, [SPHS Class of 1933] spent almost 50 years as a music and piano teacher in Montana, Iowa, Colorado and California. Now, at age 95, Sister Mary Ann is long retired, but the memories of those years and of the students she taught still resonate in the air like the last note of a beautiful symphony. “It’s hard to choose the greatest joy of my vocation,” says Sister Mary Ann, who recently celebrated 75 years as a BVM. “I have enjoyed every student and have made so many lasting relationships.”

Even Sister Mary Ann’s own life was dramatically influenced by a teacher. When she was only in seventh grade, her piano teacher suggested she start playing the pipe organ in church. Her daily practice sessions in the church led to “quick little visits with God,” which in turn made her realize that the tugging at her heart was in fact a religious calling.

Sister Mary Ann, who spent more than 20 years in volunteer ministry after she officially “retired” in 1980, says: “It’s been a joy to bring Christ and His love to everyone I meet. Life should have that love from God.”

Perhaps you remember a teacher who, like Sister Mary Ann, not only taught you how to read or write or play a musical instrument but taught you about life and about God’s abundant love. Many of these sisters are now retired and in need of medical care and support.

Currently we have 235 sisters in need of assisted or skilled care. Services range from 24-hour skilled nursing for Alzheimer’s disease and other forms of dementia to minimal assistance for the nearly independent. In addition, we have 170 retired sisters who continue to serve in ministry as volunteers in 16 states and two foreign countries.

Supporting former teachers in retirement is one way you can say thank you to these women who made a difference in your life. We realize that these are difficult times for everyone and truly appreciate whatever you can do to help us provide for our sisters, women like Sister Mary Ann, who left their stamp on eternity.

God bless you for all you do to make this world a better place. We will remember you in our daily prayers and good works.

I attended St. Paul’s primary, grammar, and high school. I shared with my group that I started piano lessons when I was in the 3rd grade and continued through most of high school. Needless to say, I think I wasted my parents’ money, but that is another issue. I had Sister Mary Emilissa in the 3rd grade for piano. This is what I find amazing. She started many of her students on the organ in St. Paul’s church. We each learned a hymn or a march, and we all had a time to play at the 9:00 Mass every Sunday. This went on through the years of grammar school. When Sister Mary Emile took Sister Mary Emilissa’s place, she continued with this program. Sister Mary Matthew [Helen Schneider] who was our high school teacher of music and glee club encouraged our efforts at the organ as well. This is a very small slice of what the BVMs gave to us. After all these years, I just wanted to express my thanks to these incredible teachers for giving me the opportunity to reach out and learn something new.

This grant, totaling \$4,000 over four years, will assist Natalie as she begins her Catholic secondary education at Convent of the Sacred Heart High School in the fall. Best wishes, Natalie!

Her teacher says: "Natalie is an absolutely sweet young lady, very intelligent, resilient, and extremely creative. She was a big part of our volleyball and basketball teams and was our female athlete of the year. She has been very involved in the parish, with altar serving and supporting numerous events. She is one of those kids who is always willing to help out whenever needed." Sounds like she's got the "Carlita" spirit!

"I get a little sentimental when ... I think of all the sacrifices my parents endured in order to provide us with opportunities they only dreamt of, and for that I am eternally grateful. It's not everyday that you realize the impact God, family and education have made on your life. Although years have gone by, the core values instilled in us remain throughout our lives and make us the people we ultimately become in life. Having a Catholic education meant faith would go far beyond the four walls of a classroom or our home. ... we learned how to genuinely care, how to love wholeheartedly and how to open our minds to new and exciting ideas. I learned that faith wasn't what you learned from a book. It's what you practice and how you apply it in everyday life. Now, years later I fondly remember those high school years. And now although time has gone by and our lives have changed, I've been fortunate enough to have found people who have traveled with me on my journey in life, who have the same beliefs, respect and admiration. I can honestly say I am very fortunate."
