On June 1, the Sister Mary Carlita, BVM Scholarship for 2011 was awarded to **Sandra Marquez**. This grant is given annually to a female graduate of St. Paul School in recognition of good character, service, and generosity, which were the hallmarks of the life of Sister Mary Carlita. Sister Carlita gave over 50 years of service to the three St. Paul's schools and acted as Moderator of the Alumnae Association for many years. This grant, totaling \$4,000 over four years, will assist Sandra as she begins her Catholic secondary education at Sacred Heart Cathedral Preparatory High School in the fall. Best wishes, Sandra!

**ST. PAUL'S CHURCH MARKED 100TH
ANNIVERSARY OF ITS DEDICATION**

August 30, 1961

Dear Parents:

The members of the faculty at St. Paul's High School are expecting your daughter to be present at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 5. Since she has registered with us, we presume that she will comply with the regulations regarding attendance and uniform.

Proper uniform will be worn the first day of school. This includes:

Skirt: plaid skirt purchased at Dennis Co. The skirt must cover the knees when the student is seated.

Blouse: white Dacron pique

Sweater: vista blue

Shoes: all white leather – not white buck or off white

Anklets: light weight, white, short

Beanies: for all school ceremonies held in church

Hats: for choir and formal occasions.

It is a mark of good breeding to be dressed neatly and in good taste at all times. We wish to call attention to the fact that eye make-up, costume jewelry, and the elaborate hair styles now in vogue are in very poor taste when worn with the school uniform. Large purses are not permitted at school at any time. The size is limited to eight inches by five inches.

If your daughter is to advance intellectually, she must spend time in home study in a quiet atmosphere every night. Consistent effort is essential.

One of the surest means of building for the future is to help your daughter avail herself of the opportunities that belong to attendance at a Catholic school. In order to promote spiritual growth, attendance is required at First Friday Mass at 8:00 a.m. in St. Paul's Church, the Candlelighting Procession in December and May Coronation.

High school life at St. Paul's is not all rules and regulations; but your daughter's stay here will be happier if she observes them. She will have used the means – self-control and respect for others – to develop character traits which will have lasting value.

It is the hope of every faculty member that every student will grow spiritually and intellectually to a maximum degree.

On May 29, 2011, one hundred years to the day of its initial dedication, St. Paul's had a glorious Mass and Reception to mark the event.

Archbishop George Niederhauer was the principal celebrant of the liturgy, joined in the sanctuary by several priests, most of whom were either vocations from the parish or who had been former pastors here. Among the SRO congregation were seven BVMS, including **Sr. Maureen O'Brien '54**, principal of St. Paul High School from 1973-1994, and **Sr. Ann Cronin '64**, last BVM principal at St. Paul Elementary School. The efforts of the combined choirs and music groups of the parish provided glorious and energetic music. Many, many alumnae and their families were present for the celebration!

Following the Mass, there was a reception in the parish center with abundant and delicious food and beverages. A display of interesting memorabilia was available, including photos of Msgr. Michael David Connolly, the pastor who undertook the construction of all the buildings, acting as his own contractor, and Tom Dolphin, the 20-year-old worker who fell to his death as the towers were being constructed and for whose widow and two children the parish established a financial assistance program. Original invoices for the marble altars, stained glass windows, and extensive wood interior work were on display. It was amazing that the church was in construction for 14 years and was fully paid for at the time of its dedication!

The legacy of faith and parish life symbolized by St. Paul's beautiful "mother church of Noe Valley" has touched all the St. Paul High School Alumnae. The number of lives impacted over the past 100+ years can never be counted. Continue to offer prayers of thanks to God for this gift and that St. Paul's will continue to nurture the faith for many decades to come.

CLASS OF 1961 FUNDS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

When Golden Belle **Barbara Russo Downing '61** could not join her class at the Mass and Luncheon in November due to a broken leg, her classmates missed her. But less than a month later, her unexpected death prompted 33 of the members of her class to make donations in her memory to the Scholarship Fund. The Scholarship Committee identified an applicant who has demonstrated service to others, just as Barbara did during her lifetime. DeVante Ellis Brown, (son of Chelise Ellis '95, who had to finish her last year of high school at Terra Nova when St. Paul High School was closed by the Archdiocese in 1994), received glowing recommendations from teachers and coaches and seemed a fitting recipient.
