## ST. PAUL CHURCH RE-DEDICATED High School Alumnae Major Contributors

What a glorious celebration on a perfectly magnificent day!! We couldn't have ordered the spring-like weather to any greater perfection. The church, the parish center, the tent between the church and school — they all looked like they were ready to be “shown off!” The liturgy on Sunday, February 4, 2001 was a sign of victory! “We made it! We did it!”

One couldn't help contrast the church filled with happy worshippers for this celebration of completion of all the retrofitting work with the somber, fearful, and passionate gathering eight years earlier when we pleaded for the life of the church and parish. The earlier one was colored by shock and disbelief; this one was of light and breath!

The music was particularly uplifting and joyous for the occasion. A large group of singers and instrumentalists combined to lead the 1,000+ worshippers who filled the church in familiar songs of praise, skillfully using both Spanish and English language and rhythms. The energy was palpable! It was said that director, Sr. Karen Conover, BVM, almost danced with enthusiasm. Topping it all off were the strains of the repaired/rebuilt pipe organ, a task which is not yet fully completed.

The congregation gave Fr. Mario Farana a standing ovation for his spirited comments about the beautiful building being only that and the importance of building the living community which proclaims the gospel and is the true church of St. Paul's. The three Officers of the BVM Congregation were present, as well as 25 Bay Area BVMs. BVM President Joellen McCarthy and Vice-President Mary Ann Zollmann had taught at St. Paul High School during the 1970s. Native St. Paul vocation, former Auxiliary Bishop of San Francisco, Bishop Carlos Sevilla, SJ, now Bishop of Yakima, WA, and one of the Honorary Chairpersons of the Capital Campaign was on the altar. Several former pastors, many priests who had served at St. Paul's, and others who had entered seminary from this parish were present. Archbishop William Levada presided.

The interior of the church is not much altered; in fact, Fr. Mario said some have asked what took so long and so much money! The two towers are now supported with sheer walls sunk down to the foundation, slightly changing the two back corners. Off the vestibule is now a much needed rest room. The side entrances are also slightly reconfigured to assist bracing the transept portion, providing protection from the icy blast of air from the outside. The new soft green carpet throughout the church complements walls and ceiling. In four side aisle areas, a few pews have been shortened to provide space for wheel chairs, and the handicapped parking and access is on the Valley Street side door. The many craftpersons (both men and women) who worked on the wood and plaster have done a magnificent job of matching the original work. It is nearly impossible to tell what is new!

The side entrances each hold about 1,000 donor names — in no particular order! Anyone who gave to St. Paul's Restoration Fund is honored, with no indication of the size of the gift. This is reminiscent of the fundraising for the construction of the church, beginning in 1895. No dedications to any person appear within the church; rather, it is the work of the whole community. In the same way, each donor is valued. The former baptistery is now the BVM chapel, with the names of the more than 350 BVM Sisters who lived and served in the parish since 1916, as well as all the priests, both pastors and associates. On the opposite wall will soon appear names of the clerical and religious vocations from the parish.

There is special gratitude for all the prayers, monetary contribution, and support which has come so generously from the high school alumnae. There really is no group like the Paulites! A thousand thank yous!

### ALUMNA HONORED FOR ARTHRITIS RESEARCH

Dr. Marian T. "Chick" Hannan '73, an Instructor in Medicine and Senior Research Associate at Harvard Medical School and the Hebrew Rehabilitation Center for Aged's Research and Training Institute, was presented the 2000 Association of Rheumatology Health Professionals Distinguished Award at their National Scientific Meeting in Philadelphia, October 30, 2000. Marian has devoted over a decade of her professional life to understanding the causes of arthritis, as well as other skeletal diseases such as osteoporosis, and developing interventions that could ease the burden of these debilitating conditions. Arthritis is the leading cause of disability in the U.S., with estimated medical care costs of \$15 billion annually. We add our congratulations to those of her professional colleagues for Marian's efforts toward understanding this disease which affects so many.

### IT'S NEVER TOO LATE!

Kathleen Twomey Millard '66, an employee of National Semiconductor, wrote excitedly to tell of her participation in a program becoming popular in Silicon Valley by which corporations assist their employees to earn college degrees.

Beginning in 1994, professors from Mission College in Santa Clara came to the company facilities twice weekly throughout the year, allowing the 20 participants to earn an AA degree in three years (in August 1997). Then, together with Hewlett Packard employees, they pursued a BS degree in Business Administration through San Jose State, awarded in August 2000.

She is grateful to have been the recipient of this corporate investment in employee education. In return, she says, her firm asked only for commitment. "I know without the backing and support of my family over the last 7 years, I may have never seen this day. When the classes were tough and the homework sometimes took over my life and weekends, they always supported my efforts."

## OLDEST KNOWN GRADUATE DIES

The Alumnae were recently notified of the passing of Helen Lacy Tait, on February 22, 2001. Helen was in the very first class of St. Paul High School, beginning in 1917, graduating in 1920 after completing the three-year commercial program. This course of studies was



the first diploma program, and then it existed along with the four-year course for a number of years. The penthouse, the small top floor of the former elementary school, held the commercial department of the high school, while other classes were scattered over various odd spaces in the convent, rectory and later the primary building.

One day in the late 1980s, Helen showed up at the high school for an alumnae event. A slightly built, sprightly woman with twinkly eyes and a sharp mind, she informed us that she had always assumed she was not an Alumnae member, since she had not completed a four-year diploma program. But she had recently become aware of our honoring her classmate Mary Connolly Bates (sister of Sister Mary Thomasette Connolly, BVM '28) as the oldest person to attend one of the annual fall Mass and Breakfast events. Helen figured if Mary was an Alumnae member, then so was she!

Not long afterward, she donated wonderful artifacts to the high school archives. Among these treasures were her diploma, signed by Msgr. Michael D. Connolly (builder of all the parish edifices) and Sister M. Conradine Davies, BVM, first St. Paul's principal, and a copy of the first "literary magazine" produced by the business department. It is manually typed and contains a delightful poem by Helen about the shenanigans the class got into when Sr. Mary Anita was out of the classroom. She also informed us that the class picture marked 1921 in the composite of four photos at the head of the "hall of pictures" was in fact her graduating group of 1920 — and she quickly identified herself and all 24 of her classmates!

Upon graduation, she worked in a secretarial capacity for a plumbing company, but she soon quit there, as she was "tired of hearing them talk about urinals."

Over the next several years, Helen attended events and stopped by for visits with Sr. Maureen O'Brien, BVM. She insisted that she was perfectly capable of jumping on the #24 Divisadero bus and returning unaccompanied to her apartment across town. She wouldn't think of having someone drive her.

On the occasion of the 75th anniversary of the school in 1992, she stood when her name was called from the roster of the first class, surprising many in attendance. Declining health in the past several years took her out of her fiercely independent living arrangement. We note with sadness her passing— and the close of an era.

### SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS FOR CHILDREN OF ALUMNAE

Last year the Alumnae Board unanimously approved a motion to disperse the 2001 fundraiser scholarship monies to the daughters and sons of alumnae who attend Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of San Francisco.

Following the school's closure, the Board had determined that financial assistance toward providing a Catholic high school education was a significant way to continue the mission and ministry of St. Paul's High School.

This assistance is in addition to the annual grant to a female graduate of St. Paul Elementary made in memory of Sister Mary Carlita, B.V.M.

An Ad Hoc Scholarship Committee has been set up to process the scholarship applications. Students/families who wish to apply for consideration should request an information packet by April 20. Write to:
