## ...and AWARDS CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS...

The Scholarship Committee recommended and the Alumnae Board approved the awarding of four \$2,000.00 scholarships to this year's applicants to assist their families in paying Catholic high school tuition. The Annual Fundraiser allows the Alumnae Association to continue the good work of underwriting the education of young students as they pursue their studies at one of the Catholic high schools in the San Francisco Archdiocese.

Each June, the Sister Mary Carlita Scholarship is awarded to a female graduate from St. Paul Elementary School, recommended for her good character, service and generosity. Since the closure of the high school, the alumnae made it possible to support students who had begun their high school with us, but had to transfer to other Catholic high schools.

Over the past three years, need-based scholarships were made available to the daughters and sons of SPHS alumnae attending area Catholic high schools. That has been broadened to include grandchildren of our alums. With tuition running more than \$6,000 annually, many families could not consider a Catholic high school education for their children without major assistance from various sources.

The scholarships were awarded to Erick Bendana (grade 10, Archbishop Riordan High School) and Danny Bendana (grade 9, Archbishop Riordan High School), sons of Donna Shields Bendana '67; to Tianna Knight (grade 9, Mercy High School, San Francisco), granddaughter of Johanna Riordan McGinty '59; and to Veronica Silva (grade 9, Immaculate Conception Academy), daughter of Tami Higuera O'Leary '84 and granddaughter of Shirley Ortega '58.

## MODERATOR'S MUSINGS Sr. Maureen O'Brien, BVM '54

My Dear Sister Graduates, Friends and Benefactors,

Here we are with anxious and heavy hearts wondering where wisdom can be found. For years we have watched our TV news programs and seen the episodes of terror throughout the world and tried to imagine what the reality was to live in such places. Maybe we were prompted to say a few prayers of gratitude that our own security was so much greater. Now, in an instant, our own experience is like that of so many other people around our globe. The horror of 9/11/01 has transformed us into people aware of our global membership.

There were a few pieces of information that did not seem to receive much attention in our media coverage. According to reports in another country (Ireland), over 2,000 of the dead in the World Trade Center were from eighty foreign countries. The homelands of these victims really saw this as a terrorist attack on the world community, not just the USA. A Muslim woman shared the fact that over 700 Muslim people were among the New York dead and spoke out about the strength of the Muslim teaching that forbids violence against women, children or the elderly, including war and/or sanctions which may target such groups.

We are from a religious tradition that was pacifist in its origin and early times. We are from a religious tradition that claims the gospel as our guide. In these days of prayer and distress, we are all invited to reflect on our scriptures in search of the wisdom we need. Let us pray that this war and all forms of violence be driven from our global home. Let us be among the blessed peacemakers who will inherit the Kin\*dom of God.

## WHERE'S THE FEMA MONEY?

When the Loma Prieta earthquake rocked the Bay Area at 5:04 p.m. on October 17, 1989, the major damage sustained by the High School was "cosmetic"... which meant, however, that the penthouse was unusable due to all the cracked and fallen plaster. The business and math classes from Rooms 19, 20, and 21 were relocated to the unused home economics room (Rooms 1 & 2) throughout the remainder of that school year.

We were fortunate to get an immediate grant of \$50,000 from Bank of America which allowed the work of repair to the three classrooms and second floor lavatory to be done over the following summer. In addition, the Federal Emergency Management Agency awarded approximately \$33,000 to the high school.

However, the State's 25% portion of that grant was challenged under the principal of separation of church and state and was withheld until the courts settled this. After four years in litigation, the money was released by the State of California. We thought it would be a short time before the more than \$8,300 would be sent from the Chancery Office.

The paper work (as with all things governmental) was extensive, and Sr. Maureen prepared it in 1989-90 and submitted it to officials at the Archdiocese. Five years later when the school was closed in June 1994, the monies due the high school were still outstanding. We kept the school bank account open, wanting to complete all transactions of sale of contents and to receive the FEMA payment before turning the balance over to the parish. Sister Karen's lament was often heard, "Where's the FEMA money?" as negotiations dragged on and on, through three different Archdiocesan persons who had oversight for these funds, and two more submissions of the entire paperwork about damage and repairs.

More than a year ago we "gave up" waiting to close the account and turned the balance over to pastor Fr. Mario Farana for parish use. But Sr. Maureen never stopped the frequent calls to the Office of Finance with inquiries about the money due St. Paul's High School. So it was with some final great surprise that she said one day last spring, "Guess what just came?" and Sr. Karen screamed, "The FEMA money!" Good records, persistence, and a belief that the parish had a right to this federal money awarded almost 12 years ago finally paid off. The parish and its restoration fund is now \$8,300 farther along toward retiring its \$1.4 million debt.

## BRENDA'S RUN

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. With this disease impacting so many women, and in turn their families, one Paulite's story and action may serve as an inspiration.

In November 1997 at the age of 29, Brenda Solorzano '86, a young lawyer, was diagnosed with breast cancer. Her treatment included a mastectomy, two rounds of chemotherapy, and radiation. Always a fighter, Brenda survived her cancer experience and vowed to remain the active person she had always been.

Although not a "runner," Brenda took up running during her cancer treatment. Her first post-surgical run equaled one mile. Now Brenda is training to run the Silicon Valley Marathon on October 28, 2001. Her dream is to finish the marathon and collect \$10,000 in sponsorship donations to help cancer patients improve their quality of life and get information, emotional support and financial help with medical expenses. She herself was the recipient of these services provided by the UCSF Comprehensive Cancer Center, which is now threatened with discontinued funding by the University.

Brenda has been dedicated to educating young women about breast cancer and the importance of breast exams. Her story has been featured on "Good Morning America," local radio shows, and in several magazines and newspapers. San Francisco Chronicle columnist and St. Paul parishioner Stephanie Salter highlighted her story on Sunday, October 14. Her courage, compassion, and unflinching dedication to the well-being of others are an inspiration.

Various sponsors/advertisers use the number of daily visits to donate a mammogram in exchange for advertising. In 2000, 4.7 million "clicks" translated into 442 free mammograms. With 43,000 women who will die from breast cancer each year, early detection and treatment is crucial.

## SISTER MARY IMMACULEE MARKS 75 YEARS AS A BVM

At a celebration on September 8, 2001, held in the Motherhouse chapel at Mount Carmel, Dubuque, IA, former faculty member Sister Mary Immaculee Walsh, BVM celebrated her Diamond Jubilee as a Sister of Charity, BVM. This was the real 75th anniversary. She entered the BVMs from Chicago in 1926 and came to St. Paul's High School on her first "mission." Among her first tasks was setting up the home economics department. She knew the founding Superior, Sister Mary Conradine Davies, BVM, who died during Sr. Immaculee's first year here. Over the multiple decades, she taught English and French and was among the last group of BVMs to leave the convent in October, 1995, just prior to its sale. The Alumnae Association presented a gift to her in honor of this milestone.

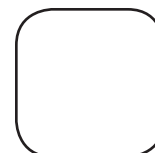
