Carmel!...the Mount Carmel of our young imaginations, the place we became misty-eyed about as we sang the hymn, Mother of Mount Carmel, never thinking we would ever be there. But, there we were, many decades later, riding along a tree lined drive, as we approached the beautiful buildings set on a bluff immediately overlooking the Mississippi. Boats, barges and steamers drifted by. A train whistle was heard. The city of Dubuque was part of the background.

Sisters Rosemary Sage, Mary Ann Shea and Jane Dolan were waiting for us with their hugs and greetings on the steps of Caritas Center. They ushered us in to experience the love and beauty of life at Mt. Carmel. Over the two days of our visit we went from one pleasant activity to the next, attending Mass and sharing meals and stories as we renewed friendships and made new acquaintances.

Everyone seemed to know we were the visitors from California! We were leisurely guided through Caritas Center, Marian Hall and the Motherhouse. A striking feature is the art work displayed throughout the buildings, all by BVM artists. The surroundings, the activities and the staff are impressive, but the love the Sisters show for each other is what is most apparent.

Our activities spread to the outdoors as we enjoyed the beautiful grounds, visiting the "Old Barn", now dedicated as the Roberta Kuhn Center. The Center serves the residents of Dubuque with classes in art, quilting and computers taught by members of the BVM Community. Learning and teaching continue. A visit to the cemetery to pray at the graves of remem-

I write to congratulate all of our faithful alumnae who are the ones who make our good works possible and to share some good news with you. Our school was taken from us over eleven years ago but nothing has daunted the spirit of our alumnae. I can never thank you enough for your wonderful hearts, your loyalty and your outstanding generosity. While I was not able to join you at our annual fundraiser last spring, I want to take this opportunity to thank every person who said those prayers that have restored me to health. I know that the God who loves us all was active in all of the details and surprises of my life and I am most grateful!

I am also very grateful for two very appreciative alumnae members and one very supportive lawyer. We have been the recipients of two more bequests that have been directed to our program of tuition assistance. Neva Abrams '65 chose St. Paul High School and the Alumnae Association to each receive one tenth of the remainder of her estate with directives on how the high school was to allocate the funds. A lawyer from her county of residence, Megan Holbrook, handled the estate and called me about possibilities of distribution. I was happy to share with her what I knew of Neva's participation in our Alumnae group and the current outreach efforts of our Association. Megan petitioned the judge to award all of the intended funds to the Alumnae Association for the tuition assistance program. The result was \$64,501.76 which is now earning interest and will be tremendous help in the years ahead when our numbers are fewer and the needs even greater.

As if one blessing were not enough, we also received word that another alumnae member, Rosemary Savage '39 remembered our Alumnae Association in her will. The pertinent section of her will reads, "...this bequest is being made by the decedent in appreciation of the fine education she received while a student at said school. Further, decedent would appreciate it if said funds were used to assist needy students with their tuition." Her generous and gracious wish has been granted and the \$10,000 received has been deposited into our account. Many of you who have regularly attended the annual Mass and breakfast/brunch or the fundraisers will remember how faithful Rosemary was in supporting the Alumnae Association.

Please keep these two women in your prayers and continue to thank God for our blessings.

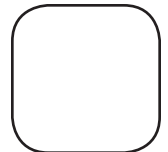
