## HOW DID ST. PAUL'S SCHOOLS BEGIN?

### BVMs OPEN SAN FRANCISCO'S ST. PAUL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN JULY, 1916

*(from the BVM Archives describing that event)*

One of the happiest gatherings at the Motherhouse in the early vacation this year was that of the Sisters who were to be the foundresses of the new California mission, St. Paul's in San Francisco. Summoned from the different houses of the Congregation, they met at Mount Carmel, and entered into a retreat conducted by Rev. Father Milet of the Society of Jesus.

The retreat closed on Saturday, July 8. In the afternoon of that day, the missionaries when over to Mt. St. Joseph College [now Clarke University] to bid farewell to the Sisters assembled there for the summer school. They were cordially entertained by Sister Mary Chionia and the faculty of the college.

On Sunday evening, after Benediction, the hymn, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, was sung by all in the chapel. Hearts throbbed and eyes were tear-dimmed; for to those who were to go to the fair city of St. Francis beside the western sea and to those who were to remain on the sunny heights above the noble river sweeping southward to the Gulf of Mexico, that hymn will always be associated with all that the Sister of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary calls home.

Monday morning the holy sacrifice of the Mass and the Holy Communion of the community were offered in honor of the Archangel Rafael for a safe journey and for the realization by each of the travelers of the angel's salutation to Tobias, Gaudium sit tibi semper, may joy be with thee always.

At breakfast, each of the mission band found a golden California poppy at her plate. She promptly pinned it on her cape and wore it proudly until a few minutes after noon, when the autos came to take the travelers to the station where they boarded a special car and were borne away to the West.

Sister Mary Conradine Davies, who has spent several years at St. Bridget's (sic) School in San Francisco, will be the Local Superior at St. Paul's. The following Sisters will form the new community:

## MORE SCHOOL HISTORY

Sister M. Conradine Davies (pictured on p.1) was the first Superior and Principal, serving six years. The enrollment of the elementary school on opening day July 31, 1916 was 529, rising to over 600 by the end of the week. Msgr. Connolly had to petition for two more Sisters, although only one, SM Placidia, was sent in September. The convent was ready for the Sisters by mid-October.

The high school program opened in 1917, with one grade added each year. Initially, the program of studies was a three-year academic and commercial program, with the first graduates in 1920. Sister Mary Rose was appointed Principal of the high school in 1922, and it became her task to develop it into a four-year academic school, which however continued to maintain a strong commercial program. High school classes had been held initially in the pent house of the grade school, and even in the gymnasium of the primary school (which had opened in 1920). The urgent need for a high school building resulted in the purchase of the property on 29<sup>th</sup> Street, and eventually the high school building was dedicated on December 3, 1924, after which the over 1500 students of the St. Paul's schools gathered in the auditorium to greet Archbishop Hanna. Classes opened in the high school building in January, 1925 and the adjacent convent was completed in May, 1926.

The BVM annals contain this description of the high school building: "The new high school of St. Paul's is beyond question one of the most perfectly constructed, best planned, and most beautiful of the buildings of our city, dedicated to the same purpose. It contains some twenty-five classrooms, perfectly illuminated, including all departments devoted to the sciences, literature, botany, biology, chemistry, physics and mathematics, together with complete commercial courses. Its lecture rooms and art studio are charmingly arranged. Its equipment throughout is complete, and equal to that of the most advanced institutions of learning in the State. In its recreation rooms, assembly hall and cafeteria, a marked advance from the standard form is to be noted in the novel and delightful arrangement of all these very essential parts. Its complete arrangements give testimony to the fact that they are the results of careful and intelligent study on the part of the designer."

SM Conradine was reappointed for a second term as Superior and Principal of the grade school in 1928 and died of pneumonia after a week's illness on December 7th. Sister Mary Immaculee Walsh met this ifounding principal when she was assigned as a young Sister to the high school in 1928. She set up and equipped the home economics department and served at SPHS from 1928-36, 1942-46, and 1964-91.

## BVM ASSOCIATE COMMITMENT

Marilyn Highlander-Pool '63, Alumnae President, made her formal commitment as an Associate of the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary at a special Mass, Saturday, August 18, 2012. About 50 BVMs, Associates, Alumnae members, and friends, and family gathered in St. Paul's Church to mark the occasion. In speaking about why she wanted to become a BVM Associate, Marilyn told of her love of the BVMs from the day she entered kindergarten with Sr. Mary Donelle through her graduation from St. Paul High School. For three years, Marilyn was part of the BVM Congregation, and although she left in 1969, her heart was always with the BVMs. She has now come "full circle" to continue to share in the life, prayer, and mission of the BVMs as a Associate member. ## SCHOOL RING LOST 63 YEARS AGO FOUND!

Imagine the surprise of Julia Ann Sullivan Rigney '58 when she received a call from Sr Karen Conover, asking if she had lost her class ring. "Yes," she replied hesitantly. "Was it in Germany?" Sr. Karen asked. "YES.... in the Rhine River!" she exclaimed.

The day before, an email had come from a man who said that in the late 1990s when he was in the army in Germany, he had been metal detecting in his off-duty time and found this ring. "The other day, I was cleaning my computer room, and saw the ring, and figured I'd try again." He pulled out his magnifying glass and gave it a longer look. He could make out "St. Paul's" and he thought "San Francisco" and J.A.S. was clearly engraved on the inside. He had tried to locate the school before, but, of course, SPHS had no website at the time he had recovered it. Now, through the wonders of the Internet, he found St. Paul High School Alumnae and emailed to say he would like to get it back to its rightful owner. A search of the database for the Class of 1958 brought up a match and a quick phone call followed.

Julia reported that she had given it to a boyfriend who was stationed in Germany, who sadly reported to her that it had been lost – in 1959! Needless to say, her mother was not happy about her having given it to him and even more so about its loss. "Holy cow," she repeated, "I just can't believe this!" Sometimes, life brings us wonderful surprises.

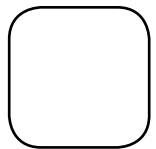
